ORANGE COUNTY, TEXAS DECLARATION OF DISASTER

WHEREAS, the County of Orange, Texas, on the 29th/30th day of May, 2024, has suffered from severe damage from the weather event that included thunderstorms and lightening activity; and

WHEREAS, the lightening damage resulted in an oil spill in Cow Bayou at Highway 105 in Orangefield, which spill has extended downstream, causing potential damage to public and private property and the general endangerment of the health and safety of the residents of Orange County; and

WHEREAS, the County Judge of Orange County, Texas, has determined, based upon information and reports received from officials and personnel within the County, that extraordinary measures must be taken to protect life, as well as to protect or rehabilitate property, and such measures are necessary and hereby ordered.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE COUNTY JUDGE OF ORANGE COUNTY, TEXAS:

- 1. That a local state of disaster is hereby declared for Orange County, Texas, pursuant to Section 418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code.
- 2. Pursuant to Section 418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code, the state of disaster shall continue for a period of not more than seven days from the date of this declaration unless continued or renewed by the Commissioners Court of Orange County, Texas.
- 3. Pursuant to Section 418.108(c) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the County Clerk.
- 4. Pursuant to Section 418.108(d) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster activates the Orange County Emergency Management Plan.
- 5. That this proclamation shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.
